MA candidates are required to demonstrate minimal skills and knowledge in the following:

- History of International Relations;
- Theory of International Relations;
- History and Structure of International Organizations;
- Georgian Political System;
- Recent History of International Politics: World War II, "Cold War";
- General Information on International Security Processes.

- 1. Discuss the essence of global influence centres or super states and their impact on world politics (state your opinions and evaluations on current international political events);
- 2. Moral and ethical factors on international relations processes (provide your argument);
- 3. Discuss the phenomenon of communism and its impact on world political processes (describe your viewpoints);
- 4. State the role of power in the general context of international relations processes (provide your viewpoints and evaluations);
- 5. Define NATO and its role in the strengthening of international security (provide concrete facts);
- 6. Discuss the reasons for the creation of UN and its role in international security processes (describe your opinions);
- 7. The essence of world security and how its components are defined (state your viewpoint and provide arguments);
- 8. International terrorism: New or old challenge of the 21st century??? (state your opinion and provide arguments).
- 9. Discuss the development of international relations discipline and the role of theories in international relations (state your opinion);
- 10. Explain the concept of national interest and how does the security dilemma affect modern international relations? (State your opinions);
- 11. What is the role of information security in the modern period of international security and what is the impact of cyber-war on the geopolitical processes of the 21st century (provide specific facts);
- 12. Talk about international humanitarian intervention and international counterterrorism operations (state your views and assessments).
- 13. The factor of hybrid warfare and soft power in modern international security (state your opinion);
- 14. Discuss the impact of coronavirus (COVID-19) on world politics (describe in your own words)

Exam Format and Assessment Criteria:

There will be a written exam for enrollment in Master's Program in International Relations and International Security.

Assessment Criteria:

- 15 Open-ended questions 15 points;
- 5 close-ended (multiple choice) questions -5 points. The exam will be considered passed if a student accumulates minimum 8 points.

You must choose one of the 4 essays presented on the exam and compose an argumentative text of at least one page; Maximum points - 10, minimum - 5 points. The maximum score is 30 points.

The exam will be considered passed if a student accumulates minimum 8 points in questions and 5 points in an essay.
